### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

The safety and security of our students and staff is a top priority for Madeline Symonds Middle School and the Halifax Regional Centre for Education. We have been implementing a number of measures as part of a comprehensive plan aimed at ensuring our school remains a safe place for our students to learn.

One of the procedures our school has been practicing is a lockdown drill. During a lockdown drill, classroom doors are secured and the students remain inside the room until instructed by the teacher to resume their activities. All exterior doors are locked and no one is permitted to enter or leave the building.

Students are kept inside the school and classrooms when circumstances make it safer to stay in the classroom rather than evacuate. Just as we prepare our students to properly respond to a fire drill, they also need to be aware of the proper response during a lockdown drill. These drills should be treated with the same level of importance as fire drills.

Please be assured that staff at our school will spend time discussing the importance of this procedure with students prior to running a drill. We will also take time after the drill to remind them that it was only a practice and there was no danger. When possible, our School Liaison Officer may assist us in conducting the lockdown drills just as the Fire Department assists with evacuation drills.

This year, the Board has directed us to complete all drills within a certain time frame and I will let you know in advance if there is a lockdown drill scheduled.

Please take the time to speak with your son/daughter about these procedures and reinforce their importance. We practice these drills to ensure our school remains a safe place for teaching and learning.

Recently we've been practicing the Hold and Secure drills which are often used when there is a situation in the building that requires students to remain in class while we deal with needs of other students. We're very pleased with how respectful and orderly the students are while dealing with this inconvenience. Please contact me if you have any questions about any of the drills and thank you for your attention to this matter.

I would also like to take this opportunity on behalf of all the MSMS Staff to commend our students on their exceptional behavior during fire drills, bus evacuations and lockdown drills. We have received positive feedback from visitors to our school with regard to how respectful and polite our students are during these situations. (Kudos to you)

I would like thank all the students for making the adjustment to the new morning procedure and remind them to wear warmer clothing as the temperatures drop. Students will be brought inside for inclement weather and during very cold temperatures and thank you to the teachers for supporting duty needs prior to their contractual time; it is greatly appreciated!

Lastly, I hope you can all find your way to feel thankful over this Thanksgiving weekend, focus on the positive and spend time with people that matter to you! Enjoy and Happy Thanksgiving one and all!



# Mi'Kmaq Heritage Month

Madeline Symonds Middle School observed *Orange Shirt Day* on October 1st. Orange Shirt Day is a day to remember the trauma that residential schools had on First Nation communities across this country. Observing this day is an important step in reconciliation between nations. The students and staff at MSMS not only observed the day by wearing orange shirts but also by learning the story/history of the day and having posters in the school that expressed why this day is observed.

MSMS staff and students are also celebrating <u>Mi'kmaq History Month</u> by putting up posters in the school, including cultural knowledge in lessons, and having Mi'kmaq, Metis, and Inuit flags present in the display at the entrance of the school. MSMS staff and students understand that First Nation, Metis, and Inuit culture is not just in the past but alive and thriving today here in Hammonds Plains and across the country.

# **Community Events**

The 250 Vimy Royal Canadian Air Cadets in Hubley, NS will be presenting to any interested grade 7 students on Oct. 15th in the library at lunch time. They are currently recruiting for there new training year. The Air Cadet program is a free organization geared for youth between the ages of 12 and 18 years old. All components of the program are provided free of cost for the cadets (uniform, travel, trips, meals during trips, etc.). The central focus is to support cadets in developing good citizenship skills, leadership skills and attain a better understanding of physical fitness and healthy living. Cadets are able to attend summer training, free of charge with a training bonus provided to them for attending, and these courses can be used towards high school credit completion.
