Celebrating Our Students

<u>Ski Trips</u>

Madeline Symonds will be holding two ski trips to Martock in February - one for grades 6 & 7 and one for grades 8 & 9. The Grade 6's and 7's will be going Tuesday, February 19th and the Grade 8's and 9's will be going Thursday, February 21st.

The cost of the trip will vary for individual students depending on if they need gear and/or a lift ticket. All students attending must pay a discounted cost of \$10 for transportation.

There are 3 options available:

- **1.** Lesson, lift ticket, rental and transportation = \$35
- **2.** Lift ticket, rental and transportation = \$25
- Transportation ONLY(Student already has their own equipment and season pass for Martock) = \$10

Ski trip forms will be available starting JANUARY 15TH. Students can pick up the forms from Mr. Landry in the Tech. Ed room (2029) or in the main office. *The deadline to return the forms is January 25th.*

Space is limited for both trips, as the bus can only accommodate 42 students. **The first 42** students that return their permission form AND payment will secure a spot.

All forms and payments must be turned in to **Mr. Landry**, so that the forms can be numbered in sequence.

Cheques must be made out to Madeline Symonds Middle School and *must include your child's name and homeroom within the memo section of the cheque.*

Busses for both trips will leave the school at approximately 9:45 am arriving at Martock for 10:45 am. Busses will leave the hill at 5:30 pm sharp. Families are responsible to make arrangements for their child/children to be picked up at MSMS at 6:30 pm. All students must be dressed properly and have adequate food and water for the duration of the trip.

Grade 10 Course Selection - Important Dates

January 15th – The IB Co-ordinator from C.P. Allen will be at MSMS to do a presentation on the IB program. This is for all grade 9 students.

January 22nd - Grade 9 Parent Information Meeting at C.P. Allen High School. This will take place at 6:30, in the cafeteria. All grade 9 parents and students are encouraged to attend!

January 29th – The C. P. Allen Guidance Counsellors will be at MSMS to present information on course selection. Please ensure all grade 9 students are in attendance to hear the important information that will be shared.

January 30th to February 5th – MSMS Guidance Counsellor will do a follow up presentation with grade 9 classes to ensure all course selection questions and concerns are addressed.

February 6th to February 19th – Students can request a meeting with Mrs. Hutchison (MSMS Guidance Counsellor) to discuss course selection, if needed.

February 20th- IB Information session with grade 9 and 10 IB parents. This will take place at C.P. Allen High School, starting at 6:30.

February 22nd – Lunch and learn at MSMS with O2 Coordinator from C.P. Allen. This if only for students applying for the O2 program.

February 22nd – Deadline for Grade 10 course selection. Hard copy of course selection needs to completed and given to grade 9 homeroom teachers.

March 1st – C.P. Allen Guidance Counsellors visit MSMS to support students with course selection input on PowerSchool.

April 3rd – O2 interviews

Parents as Career Coaches

The Department of Education and Early Childhood Development offers Parents as Career Coaches, a program offered at no cost to parents and guardians of junior and senior high school students across Nova Scotia. This program equips parents to better support their children in making informed and successful education and career choices. MSMS will be holding a one session program to help parents begin to explore their child's interest, skills & personal qualities, which will help them eventually make career decisions.

Why should I attend a PACC session?

While school staff and others play a role in a child's career journey, studies have shown that parents have the most impact. Other studies have shown that the ideal time to begin exploring careers is with children in junior high. PACC will provide you with:

- \cdot information that will help you understand and deal with the many twists and turns that can occur.
- · course selection information.
- details on critical skills and personal qualities required to be both competitive and successful, in the work force.
- resources, which will provide information on specific jobs, labour market demands, education/training requirements, salaries and much more.
- a parent guide designed to help you work with your children throughout their career journey.
 - a student workbook, which provides your daughter or son with information and activities to:
 - · Identify interests and skills
 - Research occupations

CODING COMING TO MSMS

Coding is integral to the successful development of students' critical-thinking, problem-solving and creativity skills. With this understanding, at MSMS, we continue to support students as they explore new technologies and new ways of creating solutions to problems that interest them. In the coming months we will be adding to our school's range of technology as we receive a number of Micro:Bit programmable microcontrollers for student use. Beyond the engaging simulations students may have already experienced, these devices will allow students to use the block coding framework, seen in Hour of Code puzzles and games, to program and control real electronics, including a wide range of input and output peripherals. We are excited to continue building our capacity to give students' access to tools they may use to eventually create solutions to problems we have yet to encounter.
