Nut Aware/Scent

Madeline Symonds Middle School has students and staff who have severe allergic reactions to peanut butter, peanuts, nuts and other food products. It is of vital importance that your child(ren) do not bring peanut butter, peanuts, or peanut/nut products to school. We appreciate your support in this matter as it enables us to have a safe environment for all our students and staff.

As well, there are environmental issues with respect to the use of scents. We have students, staff and parents who are very sensitive to scents. Therefore, we would ask that students, staff and visitors not wear perfume or scented products while at the school.

Student Fees

Student Fees are paid by all students and are \$25, however there is a maximum of \$40 per family with more than one child in the school. These fees contribute to the cost of activities and events that are non-curriculum and non-program based. They help us to provide our students with their student photo IDs, combination locks, locker upkeep, agenda books for our grade 6's, mail -outs (notices) from the office, and also assist in supplementing student athletic and other special events for your students.

MSMS has a very large and impressive band program. Students participating in the band program are asked to pay a band fee to help supplement the program. The band fee of \$30.00 is payable to Madeline Symonds Middle School, your child can pass this in directly to their homeroom teacher. (The Band fee largely pays for the rental of busses, uniforms, etc.)

Celebrating our Students

One of our grade 8 students, Olivia Oliver, who last year broke the Guinness World Record for the fastest spinner on ice skates, has decided to donate her Guinness World Record-Breaking Figure Skates and her official Guinness World Record Certificate to a child with spina bifida and other life-limiting conditions.

Just over a year ago 9 year-old Weronika was in the National Stadium in Warsaw to watch Olivia break the world record and her mom recently wrote to say that Weronika's wish is to personally meet Olivia.

So Olivia is going to autograph her skates and certificate and take them to Weronika in Poland, on a surprise "wish-trip" visit in August that was arranged with her mom, before Weronika goes into hospital again for another difficult operation on her spine.

"Weronika has had many painful surgeries. I can't help cure her but I want her to know that she must keep fighting and never give up and that I'm with her all the way", said Olivia.

After meeting with Weronika, Olivia will be joining a small group of other volunteers to visit the homes of 10 more sick kids to bring some happiness into their lives.

Visitors to MSMS

We truly want the community to feel welcome at MSMS. Research shows that strong community involvement in schools is directly linked to how students value education. It is encouraging to see the interest that the community takes in the education of our young people.

As learning and safety is our priority for our students, we have a number of procedures in place which will be implemented if ever needed. We kindly request the following:

- All visitors/parents must report to the office to sign in and get a visitor's identification card. The card must be
 worn to identify you as a visitor. At the end of your visit, we ask that you sign out and return the badge.
- Parents wishing to sign students in or out of the building must identify themselves and register this
 information at the office.
- All school staff must wear identification cards on their person at all times.

Also for your information, video cameras have been installed throughout the school and exterior doors are alarmed throughout the day.

We hope that everyone understands the need for these precautions and we thank you an advance for your cooperation.

Costly Items

We would like to caution both students and parents regarding bringing costly items to school. In the past a number of students have lost valuable items. Parents may consider it advisable for their children to leave these valuables at home. If they do bring them to school, they must be in lockers during class time. It is also important to enforce with your child the fact that they do need to lock their lockers. Some of our students have a tendency to leave their locker unlocked, and as a result, some items may become missing. We appreciate your support with this. It is also important for students to not tell others the combination to their lock.

Public Health Services will be offering immunizations to grade 7 students for the 2016/17 school year: These will begin November 1st. Information will follow throughout the fall.
